

After Antholz comes Dresden: M4Energy City Biathlon brings medal glory and World Cup excitement to the Elbe

Tickets available – best seats overlooking the shooting range in especially high demand

Dresden. With the Winter Olympics now concluded, Germany's biathlon team has shown strong performances: the biggest highlight was **bronze in the mixed relay**. German athletes finished within touching distance of the podium, recording four fourth-place results overall – **Philipp Horn's** fourth place in the mass start kept the excitement going until the very end. Beyond that Germany secured a further eight top ten finishes. There was also a moment of symbolic significance: Germany's men's biathlon relay team was retrospectively awarded Olympic gold from Sochi 2014. The Games concluded on an emotional note as **Franziska Preuß** announced her **immediate retirement after the Games** before the mass start.

No sooner has the Olympic excitement subsided than fans are already looking ahead to the next duels, the next goose bump moments and an event where you can experience biathlon closer than almost anywhere else.

On **Sunday, August 23, 2026, M4Energy City Biathlon Dresden** will once again turn the Saxon capital into an arena for world-class biathlon. And best of all, **Olympic medalists** will be on display in Dresden, up close and live on ZDF. The combination of elite competition, stadium atmosphere and the exceptional proximity to the athletes creates an experience that captivates spectators and competitors alike.

Anyone keen to witness, those decisive seconds should move quickly: tickets are available and the **best seats** are selling fast – especially those with a **commanding view of the shooting range**, where races are won and lost, leads are overturned and every hit becomes a moment of jubilation. In the stadium area, a variation of grandstand options offers excellent sightlines across the course. The popular "Hautnah" zone places fans within arm's reach of the action, offering an intensity rarely matched by any other format. For visitors travelling from further afield, an attractive **package deal including an overnight stay** at the athletes' hotel, INNSIDE by Meliá is also available – ideal for combining the M4Energy City Biathlon Dresden with a memorable weekend in the Saxon capital.

All tickets are available online at www.city-biathlon.com. Spectating along the course remains free of charge; however, those aiming to secure the best perspective should not leave it too late.

Further information regarding the line-up and the program will be announced in the coming months. One thing is already certain: on August 23, 2026, Dresden will once again become a stage for biathlon – and the Olympic spirit will live on with every shot.
